5 You take safety seriously, and so do we

We take safety as seriously as you do. We also make space for your child to take safe risks. The difference between risk-taking behaviour and providing a safe environment is important.

Risk-taking allows children to assess and make decisions using their judgment and intuition. This is a skill we encourage. We offer plenty of opportunities to get messy, explore, and try new things.

We do this while following strict health and safety guidelines, keep our firstaid qualifications current and ensure our comprehensive child well-being and safety policies and procedures are always followed.

Safety and risk work together. Safety provides a physically and emotionally secure space where children can engage with risk (experiment and try things out). They can learn and take risks without causing harm to themselves and others. It also means we can return them to you each day happy, tired and ready to do it all again tomorrow.







We're open up to 12 hours, Monday to Friday, to support your busy schedule.

Not everyone needs all-day care, so we also offer 9 and 10 hour sessions to help reduce your out-of-pocket costs.

Finally, we're government accredited. You can be confident your child gets the best early learning and care, no matter the hours. Greater convenience for you, plus a quality environment for your child to thrive in.

We'll help you work out what your childcare will cost

Government help is available to many families to help cover the cost of child care. This assistance is a discount you get from the Australian government called the Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

On top of your CCS, some states also give you further discounts for kindergarten and preschool.

The cost of childcare also changes depending on how many sessions your child attends each week and the session lengths.

This can make the cost of childcare, kindergarten or preschool tricky to work out. We understand that.

As a government-approved child care provider, we'll help you understand the support you're eligible for and how to access it. Our centre directors and Family Services Teams can help you select the session lengths and times that provide the best value to you and your family.
